Longitudinal Care Management

Common Referral Triggers:

- Presence of progressive, chronic, or life-threatening illness
- Transitions of care between Inpatient and Outpatient settings
- Terminal illness
- High risk preanancies
- Acute injury or exacerbation of a chronic illness
- Complex social factors
- Children with special health care needs
- Multiple hospitalizations or emergency room visits
- Medical equipment needs
- Complex Care Coordination
- Behavioral Health support needs

Quality Improvement Highlight: Understanding the Age 2 Immunization Measure & Key Tactics to Drive Improvement & Help Our Network Potentially Earn an Additional \$2.5 Million!

Definition Overview: Completion of 10 immunization series (DTaP, IPV, MMR, Hib, Hepatitis B, PCV, VZV, Rotavirus, Hepatitis A, Influenza) by the child's 2nd birthday.

Age 2 Immunizations (Combo 10) Measure Definition

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- Continuous Enrollment Requirement
 - No more than 1 gap in enrollment up to 45 days during 12 months prior to the child's 2nd birthday.

Highlighted Improvement Tactics:

- Standardization of Vaccination Administration within Practice (i.e. what products administered at each standard well visit up to 2 years old)
- Perform outreach to patients included on age 2 immunization worklists that include Blue KC patients 16 to 24 months in need of 1 or more catch up vaccines before 2nd birthday.

- Integrate a New Age 2 Immunization Catch Up Pre-Visit Planning Report into Clinical Workflow

New Age 2 Immunization Catch Up Pre-Visit Planning Report

- Objective: Weekly Automated Report of Blue KC Patients with Scheduled Visits in Next 7 Days Requiring an Age 2 Immunization Catch Up Vaccination
 - 16 to 24 Months Needing 1 or More Age 2 Immunizations (Non-Flu & Non-Rotavirus)
 - · 6 to 8 Months Needing 1 or More Rotavirus Vaccinations
 - · 12 Months to 24 Months Needing 1 or 2 Flu Vaccinations
- Benefit / Value:
 - Highly Targeted, Actionable, & Complementary to Blue KC 90th Percentile Outreach Lists
 - · Systematically Drive Improvement on Ongoing Basis to Drive Short- and Long-Term Improvement
