- 1. Log into InNote
- 2. If a patient screens positive for SDOH needs, search for resources
  - Utilize full-service CBOs, start with our CBO Referral Partners
    - 1. Metro Lutheran Ministry covers Clay and Platte Counties
    - 2. El Centro covers Wyandotte and Johnson Counties
    - 3. Bishop Sullivan covers Jackson and Clay Counties
    - 4. Community Services League covers Jackson County
    - 5. Community Assistance Council covers southern Jackson County
  - Search for CBO name and refer to 'Community Services (Children's Mercy Only)' programs
- 3. Complete referral form
- 4. Send/share referral information
- 5. Document referral in EMR

### **CBO Pilot Patient Success Story**

- A Meritas provider identified a patient had housing needs through the SDOH Screening. The provider asked the family if they would like to be connected to resources. After the family said that they would like help, they met with the Meritas Lift Up KC SuperUser.
- The SuperUser connected the family with Metro Lutheran Ministry who was able to provide the family with rent assistance and utilities assistance.

SuperUser Perspective

"The MA came to me and said there was a patient who needed housing resources. I met with the family after their visit with the doctor and provided them with a plan. I said first we will reach out to MLM. If they can't help, I have other options lined up. They were really scared because they were potentially going to be evicted."

#### **Patient/Family Perspective**

"I was very happy to talk about these needs. Embarrassed too, but I knew we needed to talk about it. The practice did a great job speaking with me about my needs and getting me help. We weren't aware that the practice would help us get resources. Getting help from MLM was an extremely easy and comfortable experience. They were so helpful and nice. I don't really know what else to say other than they were a godsent."

#### **CBO Perspective**

"The family came prepared with all their paperwork and within a few days of their referral, I was able to get them utilities help & help with rent back pay. I set them up with some rental assistance for more recent months as well, but I am worried about that family. I plan to check back in and hopefully they know they can reach back out to us too."
