Based on preliminary results, the network exceeded the goal in 4 of 6 Blue KC quality measures in 2016.

**Annual Network Incentive Expected to Range Between \$792k-1,567k dependent on 2016 Cost Performance**

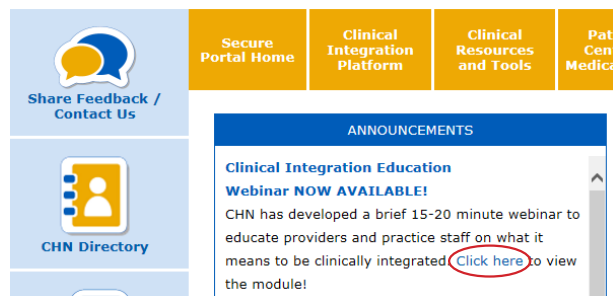
