Update on Important HEDIS Measure Definition Changes: Use to Update & Inform Treatment

Appropriate Treatment for URI: Summary of Most Impactful Changes

- Removed Exclusion to Exclude Encounters with Any Diagnoses Other than URI
 Implication: Denominator Increases Significantly (2.6 Times as Large)
- Changed from Member-Based Denominator to <u>Episode-Based Denominator</u>
- o Implication: 1 Member May be Included in Measure Multiple Times
- Expanded Age Range from 3 Months to 18 Years Old to 3 Months and Older
- Important: Measure evaluated July 1st of prior year to June 30th of the measurement year
 - o Implication: Measurement Year 2021 Evaluation Started July 1st, 2020!

Appropriate Testing for Pharyngitis: Summary of Most Impactful Changes

- Removed Exclusion to Exclude Encounters with Any Diagnoses Other than Pharyngitis
 - o **Implication**: Denominator Increases Significantly (40% Larger)
- Changed From Member-Based Denominator to Episode-Based Denominator
 - o Implication: 1 Member May be Included in Measure Multiple Times
- Expanded Age Range from 3 to 18 Years Old to 3+ Years Old
- · Important: Measure evaluated July 1st of prior year to June 30th of the measurement year
 - o Implication: Measurement Year 2021 Evaluation Started July 1st, 2020!

Highlights from CIN Trending Quality Performance (All Patients Included)

- Performance increases of 52-65% points across 4 screening measures
- Performance increases of 6-31% points across 4 immunization measures
- More than 400% increase in HPV Immunization since 2016!
- Adolescent and 3-6 Year Well Visit performance up 6% points
- 15 Month Well Visit (6+ Visits) performance up 18% points!
- Asthma 2+ Office Visits performance increased 23% points!
- Chlamydia Screening performance increased 7% points
- ADHD Management performance increased 10% points



Children's Health Network Trending Performance – **CIN Quality Improvement** (Immunization Measures)




Highlights from HEDIS Trending Quality Performance (CMHN Attributed Patients)


Thank You!

- Chlamydia Screening performance increased 20% points!
- Nearly 20% point increase in HPV Immunization performance!
- 15 Month Well Visit (6+ Visits) increased 2% points and above national 90th percentile (89.6%)
- 3-6 Year Well Visit increased 6% points
- Adolescent Well Visit increased 3% points and above national 90th percentile (65%)
- Asthma Medication Management (i.e. ≥ 75% controller usage) increased 10% points
