Longitudinal Care Management

Common Referral Triggers:

- Presence of progressive, chronic, or life-threatening illness
- Transitions of care between Inpatient and Outpatient settings
- High risk pregnancies
- Acute injury or exacerbation of a chronic illness
- Complex social factors
- Children with special health care needs
- Multiple hospitalizations or emergency room visits
- Medical equipment needs Complex Care Coordination
- Behavioral Health support needs

Quality Improvement Highlight: Understanding the Age 2 Immunization Measure & Key Tactics to Drive Improvement & Help Our Network Potentially Earn an Additional \$2.5 Million!

Definition Overview:

Completion of 10 immunization series (DTaP, IPV, MMR, Hib, Hepatitis B, PCV, VZV, Rotavirus, Hepatitis A, Influenza) by the child's 2nd birthday.

Age 2 Immunizations (Combo 10) Measure Definition

- Eligible Population
 - · Children turning 2 years old in the measurement year
- Compliance

[HEDIS Allowed Vaccination Age Ranges]

- · Evidence of receiving the following by 2 years of age:
 - [42 days to 2 years] 4 DTaP o 3 IPV [42 days to 2 years] [1 years to 2 years] 1 MMR o 3 Hib [42 days to 2 years] o 3 Hepatitis B [Birth to 2 years]
- [42 days to 2 years] o 4 PCV
- o 1 VZV [1 years to 2 years] 2 or 3 Rotavirus* [42 days to 2 years]
- * dependent on vaccine series [1 years to 2 years] 1 Hepatitis A
- 2 Influenza [180 days to 2 years]
- Continuous Enrollment Requirement
 - No more than 1 gap in enrollment up to 45 days during 12 months prior to the child's 2nd birthday.

- Perform outreach to patients included on age 2 immunization worklists that include Blue KC patients 16 to 24 months in need of 1 or more catch up vaccines before 2nd birthday. [Lists shared with CMHN Committee Attendees]

Age 2 Immunizations Catch Up Weekly Pre-Visit Planning Report


Report Objective: Supports pre-visit planning for patients with scheduled appointments over the next 7 days who are missing Age 2 immunizations.

Report Distribution Logistics:

- Weekly Automated Distribution
- Sent via Email at 7:30am on Fridays
- Includes Primary Care Appointments for Next 7 Days
- Distribution Lists were Gathered by Your PHM Network Representative
- Initial report will only include Blue KC "Home" patients (i.e. claims processed & paid by local Blue KC on the basis of quality/utilization performance evaluation in Blue KC Primary Care First value based care

Alerts included in this report:

- 16 to 24 Months Needing 1 or More Age 2 Immunizations (Non-Flu & Non-Rotavirus)
- 6 to 8 Months Needing 1 or More Rotavirus Vaccinations
- 12 Months to 24 Months Needing 1 or 2 Flu Vaccinations
