     <u>Minimum of 14 days between visits</u>
  - Continuous Enrollment Requirement: 31 days through 15 months of age. No more than one gap in enrollment of up to 45 days during the continuous enrollment period.

Blue KC Target 2019 Target: 88.3% (Increase of 3.1% Points)

(Approximately HEDIS 90th Percentile)



- Recommended Preventive Visit Schedule
  - 1. 3-5 Day Visit

- \*\* A 2 week visit may be added for clinical reasons but may not count toward 6 visits due to the 2 week minimum.
- 2. By 1 Month Visit (Recommended at 3-4th week of life; minimum of 2 weeks after 3-5 Day Visit)
- 3. 2 Month Visit
- 4. 4 Month Visit
- 5. 6 Month Visit
- 6. 9 Month Visit
- 7. 12 Month Visit
- 8. 15 Month Visit (typically performed <u>after</u> 15 months old)



## WELL-CHILD VISITS IN THE FIRST 15 MONTHS OF LIFE - BEST PRACTICES

### Summarized Best Practices

- Schedule the next recommended visit <u>before the family leaves the office</u>.
   If possible, schedule the next visit when the family arrives and is waiting in the waiting room. May consider <u>scheduling multiple future preventive visits</u>.
- Have physicians and care staff remind families about the importance of 15-month well visits during the visit and schedule the next appointment before the family leaves.
- Send patient reminders (via email, phone, text, robo-calls) about a patient's upcoming appointment.
- Schedule the "By 1 Month Visit" the 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> week of Life to Ensure 14
   Day Minimum is Exceeded

→ Why? Ensure both well visits within first month of life count toward compliance!
